Legal entity

A legal entity is not a person but an organisation that has its own rights and obligations. A *vereniging* may have full or limited legal authority. With full legal authority, a civil-law notary draws up articles of association. With limited legal capacity, it is established without a civil-law notary. The board can then draw up its own articles of association. These contain the internal rules and agreements of the legal entity.

Principal establishment

A business location where the *vereniging* carries out its activities. These can be both commercial activities and non-commercial activities. Not every *vereniging* has a business location. If there are multiple business locations, one is listed as the principal establishment or head office. Each business location has a unique establishment number.

Members of the Supervisory Board

In addition to a board of directors, a legal entity can also have a Supervisory Board. This is also known as a supervisory council. This supervises the board and the policy of the organisation.

Establishment

A business location where the *vereniging* carries out its activities. These can be both commercial activities and non-commercial activities. The locations listed here are known as branches or secondary establishments. Each branch has a unique establishment number.

Company

A company is a business that supplies products or services to customers and aims to make a profit. The profit must be used for the purpose for which the *vereniging* was established.

Board member

A board member is a person who is in charge of and responsible for the day-to-day running of the organisation. A board member represents the organisation to the outside world.

Authorised representatives

The board can grant power of attorney to a person. This can be limited power of attorney or full power of attorney. The authorised person may then carry out legal tasks on behalf of the organisation.

Date and time

The date and time the extract was made.

'Optional' means a category is only visible on the extract if it applies to the organisation for which the extract was requested. No rights can be derived from this example.
